Short Description

This course is expected to enrich the students' knowledge in terms of the "patient-pharmacist relationship", also it provides them with a solid background and a base of systematic thinking for the sake of formatting an optimal treatment plan that suites the individual patient's needs.

Course Objectives

The **aim** of this course is to expose the students to the comprehensive process of pharmaceutical care, and to shed light systematically on the whole process of patient care, focusing on the non-pharmacological aspects of the treatment process and over-the-counter drug therapy.:

1) To get an Introduction to pharmaceutical care.

2) To describe the Drug therapy problems.

3) To describe the treatment guidelines for rheumatology, contraception, smoking cessation, Eye ear drops in addition to Nutritional supplements.

4) To describe How to use Inhaler devices.
