Short Description

This course aims at improving the four major skills of the English language: reading, listening, speaking and writing. It aims at improving the student's language skills in preparing for their university study. This course is designed to focus primarily on the reading strategies necessary in university environment. It seeks to provide opportunities to increase student's reading speed, and to apply the following reading skills: skimming, scanning, guessing meanings from the context, identifying pro-form references, and extracting main ideas and specific details from a text. Issues pertaining to grammar will be addressed only as needed.

Course Objectives

This Course aimed to:

- Demonstrate reading and pre-reading strategies; including predicting content, skimming, scanning, making inferences, and identifying stated or implied main ideas and supporting details.
- Differentiate between formal and informal texts.
- Fill in an official document by following instructions.
- Check the written texts for spelling and grammar mistakes and punctuation.
- Use brainstorming strategy in enhancing the students" thinking and imagination.
- Use varied academic vocabulary in different contexts.
- Differentiate between different types of texts.
- Recognize the purpose and expected audience of the text.
- Develop of the ability to read correctly.
- Differentiate between fact and prediction.
- Demonstrate the fundamental structures.
- Develop the student ability to find reliable information on the Internet.

Plagiarism
