Short Description

This course aims to introduce students to the historical developments in the different methods and doctrines of teaching English as a foreign language (the method of understanding language structure through translation, the direct method, the audio-linguistic method, the mental method, the communicative method) and their relationship to the different linguistic and psychological schools of thought. In addition, the course provides a practical application of the interactive and communicative teaching method in language teaching and learning. Moreover, this course aims to develop effective skills and strategies in teaching a foreign language using some of the methods and approaches as well as training the student to use advanced methods in teaching specific language activities and skills. The course uses videos and practical application. The course deals with curricula, teaching methods, organization of study units, language and speech assessment procedures, and strategies related to studying English as a foreign language.

Course Objectives

This course aims to

- Expand students' knowledge of Language teaching methods and approaches
- Relate the methods to different linguistic and psychological schools of thought
- Teach students the practical application of the interactive and communicative teaching method in language teaching and learning
